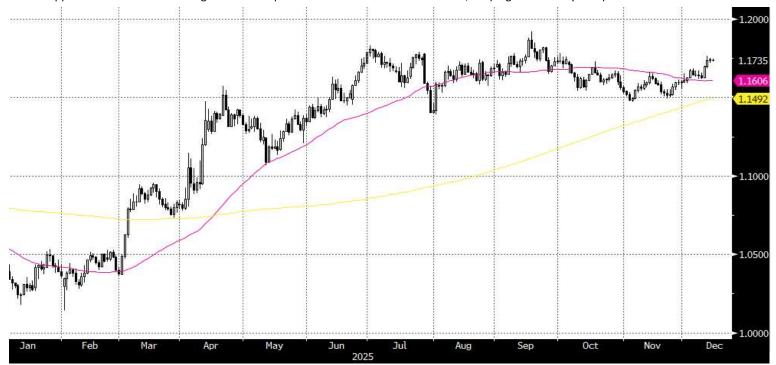


Global Update

S&P 500 and Nasdaq 100 futures rose about 0.2% in Asian trading after both indexes fell more than 1% on Friday, largely due to tech stock weakness. South Korea: Down 1.6%, reflecting cooling enthusiasm around Al-related stocks. China: Slight declines after data showed retail sales growth at its weakest since Covid and further drops in investment. Gold had a fifth consecutive day of gains: This suggests strong momentum, likely driven by uncertainty around Fed policy. Global risk appetite has been ebbing amid skepticism that tech stocks, which have propelled global benchmarks to record highs, can continue to warrant their lofty valuations and aggressive Al spending. Much of that investment reflects a long-term bet on technologies that may take years to generate meaningful commercial returns, adding to near-term uncertainty. From a recent selloff in the shares of Nvidia Corp., to Oracle Corp.'s plunge after reporting mounting spending on Al, to souring sentiment around a network of companies exposed to OpenAl, signs of skepticism are increasing. Looking to 2026, the debate among investors is whether to rein in Al exposure ahead of a potential bubble popping, or to double down to capitalize on the game-changing technology. Treasuries were steady Monday as a debate raged in markets and among Fed officials on how much to ease policy next year.

Cleveland Fed President Beth Hammack said she would prefer interest rates to be slightly more restrictive to keep putting pressure on inflation. Chicago Fed President Austan Goolsbee said he is projecting more interest-rate cuts for 2026 than many of his colleagues.

The EUR/USD pair kicks off the new week on a softer note, though it remains within striking distance of the highest level since early October, touched last Thursday. Spot prices currently trade around the 1.1730 region, down less than 0.10% for the day. From a technical perspective, the near-term outlook for EUR/USD is bullish. It stands 23 pips above the day's opening price, and the 20-period Simple Moving Average (SMA) climbs above the 100- and 200-period SMAs, with all three rising, supporting the bullish case. Price holds above these averages, and the 20-period SMA at 1.1656 offers nearby dynamic support. Meanwhile, the Momentum indicator holds above its midline and extends higher, signaling strengthening buying pressure. The Relative Strength Index (RSI) at 69 is approaching overbought readings, and further upside could slow as conditions stretch. Initial support is clustered at the rising 20- and 100-period SMAs between 1.1656–1.1603, keeping the intraday bias positive while above this band.
